They are informed of this on entry, through information sheets and at briefings when they arrive if they are part of a booked organised group. • They are specifically responsible for ensuring the child carries out the hand washing process when needed and that the child uses the play equipment sensibly. • School, Play and Birthday Party Groups are given specific information sheets and copies of the relevant risk assessment sheets when they book. Information regarding specific hazards and controls is contained in that information. • Not all activities are supervised by Willows Staff. Supervision is varied for each activity according to how busy we are or whether it's a specific activity that requires supervision. • Specific hazards are subject to remedial actions, however it is recognised that hazards associated by normal life are not able to be fully mitigated. Hazards such as tripping when running about or falling off of an item of equipment not designed for climbing. • Care has been taken not to reduce the learning experience to an un-meaningful level. The correct balance between learning about risk and freedom from serious injury has been sort throughout, in accordance with the HSE Guidance Document – Managing Risk in Play.
